

Indicators of community support for SLP









- The community has expectations, but
 - They are not always aligned to the IDP
 - the community protests about project selection, or does not use the infrastructure, or burns it down
- Understanding of the local social environment, the stakeholders and dynamics
 - What is the community calling out for?
- Engage the local municipality through the LED Forums
 - Based on engagement with communities, attend the meetings and influence the selection of projects
 - Undertake research
 - Manage stakeholder expectations



Challenge 2: Project Implementation




- The implementation model:
 - Hand over the budget to the municipality?
 - Company implementation?
- Both models generally results in delays
- Companies are rushed and under pressure to comply. Breaks down trust, legitimacy and respect, and high levels of irritation
- Agreements with LM and project partners on the implementation plan is necessary
- Secure agreements with LM about planning for implementation
- Demonstrate to DMR a feasible implementation plan
- Improve implementation models and testing project feasibility
- Infrastructure projects versus capacity building / enterprise development projects?
- Opportunities for collaboration?
